Neighborhood Watch members receive monthly crime information and newsletter via email. Join now!

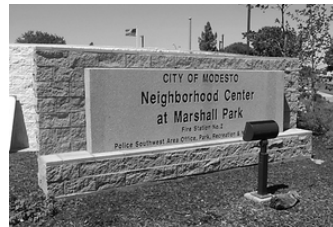

NEIGHBORHOOD CENTER AT MARSHALL PARK BY CINDY RHEA

The Weed and Seed Office moves to Marshall Park! Weed and Seed is an initiative to fight crime and improve the Paradise South Neighborhood via meeting, engaging, and collaborating with the local community.

The new Neighborhood Center at Marshall Park combines Fire, Police, Parks, Recreation and Neighborhood Department activities into one service center location. This is the first facility of its kind in the Modesto metropolitan region. Fire Station Number two was relocated to this site. The facility provides the Marshall Park Neighborhood with an opportunity to interact with one another as well with city employees for recreation, crime prevention, and fire prevention activities.

The Neighborhood Center is also ready to turn into an emergency haven in case of particular local crisis or emergencies.



Paradise South residents are very fortunate to have the Weed and Seed project in Modesto. Every year, hundreds of cities nationwide compete for this federal initiative which grants Weed and Seed communities up to \$1 million in federal funding over a five-year period.

We are now finishing our third year of funding in which

we were awarded \$150,000 to help continue the efforts to reduce crime and blight and increase services for the approximate 17,000 residents who live in the area. These activities include: extra law enforcement to focus on gangs and drugs; increased code enforcement to reduce blight; youth programs such as Girl Scouts, Boy Scouts, Jr. Cadets, camps, activities at Maddux Youth Center; and free income tax preparations at the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance Center.

I encourage residents to take advantage of the activities and services available in the Paradise South neighborhood and to get involved in the Weed and Seed efforts to help our local community. You can help make a difference in Paradise South!

Stanislaus County is offering a new service to residents of the unincorporated areas of the county. The Abandoned Vehicle department will remove, FREE of charge, vehicles that have been abandoned or are no longer running, as well as some vehicle parts (such as engines). The Abandoned Vehicle department will also remove things like campers, motor homes, diesel rigs and even boat trailers carrying a boat at no cost. REPORTING SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY

Many crimes can be prevented by reporting suspicious activity to the police non-emergency dispatch number at 552-2470. Crime prevention is more than just a police officer's job. It is the responsibility of all of us who live, work and do business in Modesto.

When you see a crime in progress do not hesitate to call 9-1-1. If you're calling from a cell phone, call 558-HELP, this will connect you to Modesto 9-1-1.

You do not have to give your name, phone number and address when reporting a crime or suspicious activity, you can be **anonymous**.

Be a good witness, give the location of activity, details, and a complete description of the person(s) involved starting from head to toe. If the suspect(s) are in a car, give a license plate number if possible, color, make or model of vehicle, and anything that makes it stand out

(such as a missing hubcap or stickers), and how many occupants and direction of travel.

A suspicious person is anyone who loiters in your neighborhood, place of business, or someone going door-to-door. The person may be male or female dressed in any manner, of any age, race, color or cultural background. Be alert for cars cruising or circling your block. It could be a burglar looking for any easy targets or opportunity.

Frequent visitors coming and going from a particular house, apartment or street corner especially at odd hours on a daily or regular basis could indicate illegal drug activity. You can call the drug hotline, 571-3784 to report what you have observed. Your information will be recorded on an answering machine. You do not have to leave your name or address but again could be helpful in case more information is needed. Your information is confidential.

The Modesto area express (MAX) bus system has added a new route, Route 43, which conveniently has a stop directly in front of the Paradise Medical Office and Urgent Care Center. 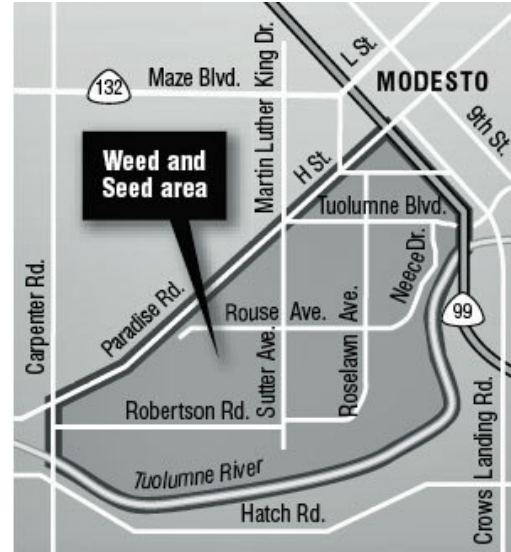
